Sidewalk Shoveling 2 Inch Rule

When the snow is over 2 inches and it's time for your sidewalk entrances to be shoveled... Please make sure your personal items, chords, decorations, lighting, etc. on or near your walks are clear from the path needed for shoveling or snowblowing by our vendors. (You would be responsible for any accidental breakage.)

2 Vehicles or More

If you have 2 vehicles, one must be parked IN THE GARAGE during snow removal. Second vehicle must be pulled up as close as possible to the garage door. If you have a 3rd vehicle, call the HelpLine and we will work with you for your particular situation.

Did You Know? There Are Three!

Did you know that there are 3 Condominium Associations within our complex? Ours, which is MBCA plus CCC & DAS.
MBCA - Consists of 12 buildings: 4 buildings on the West side and 8 buildings on the East side. (2575 on the West side is the ONLY building facing Telluride Trail street side.) To the general public, it appears as one extensive association covering all 15 buildings. DAS & CCC do not have signs identifying their individual associations. We have 2, one at each of our driveway entrances.
CCC - Consists of 2 buildings in the MIDDLE of our 12. Street address of 2559 Telluride Trl (faces Telluride Trail street side) and 2563 (across from our Greenspace).
DAS - Consists of 1 building, street address of 2527 Telluride Trl (also faces Telluride Trail street side).

20/20 Another Way to LOOK @ 2020

THIS: Martin Luther King Jr., the civil rights leader, born 90 years ago is honored in January. Entered college at age 15; graduated with his PhD at the age of 25. Won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964 at age 35. Jailed 29 times. Gave the speech "I've Seen The Promised Land" on April 3, 1968; he was assassinated the next day. President Ronald Reagan named the 3rd Monday in January as the holiday observance of Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday.
