MBCA Insurance Guidelines

The following is an excerpt from our insurance agent regarding the insurance coverage of our 12 buildings.

Begin quote: "According to the association by-laws, (Association board and its lawyer are responsible for making sure what is accurate within the by-laws), Mountain Bay has a "studs-in" insurance policy. What that means is if a major incident were to happen, fire, tornado, etc. the Association's policy would need to repair or replace items to the like kind and quality of the original build. The Association would be responsible for the standard items when they originally built the units, electrical, plumbing, drywall, flooring, cabinets. Any interior upgrades made by the condo owner would need to be added/covered on their personal condo policy. If the condo owner upgrades their flooring, or gets new cabinets and countertops, they should add that amount to their personal condo policy.

Items such as washers & dryers, appliances, furniture, upgraded light fixtures, would not be covered under the Association's policy. Please be sure to have them covered on your personal condo insurance policy.

A bit of advice for when a condo unit is sold. Be sure to have the seller update the buyer as to what was upgraded or replaced, and the total approximate cost, as the new unit owner should add that cost to their personal homeowner's policy.

The information provided is to the best of my knowledge and the information from the underwriters and loss control at Midwest Family Mutual Insurance, your current insurance carrier. Any changes made to the current policy or by-laws may affect the outcome of a claim." End quote

CLEANING YOUR DRYER VENT

Please Take Note... Your Neighbor is Counting on it!

*When it comes to home maintenance, some of the most crucial tasks are the ones commonly neglected. When was the last time you had thoughts of your clothes dryer? Dryer maintenance requires cleaning the lint screen after each load; the real concern is your dryer's vents. Clogged vents can cost you money and possibly your home ~ and recall that you have adjoining walls, so it would involve your neighbors. Cleaning your <u>vent</u>ilations systems professionally, once a year is the recommendation.

*Some warning signs indicating your dryer vent isn't working/ ventilating properly:

- + Laundry takes longer than usual to completely dry
 - + Dryer is unusually warm
 - + Clothes are unusually warm
 - + Clothes have a strange smell

*Lint, clogging your vent, is highly flammable and can pose a fire hazard. Blocked vents can also cause carbon monoxide to back up into your home instead of being exhausted outdoors.

*Did you know that you should avoid running your dryer for several cycles in a row? Give your dryer a break in between cycles. This enables the dryer to cool down and completely ventilate the hot, humid air from the previous cycle.
